What are the verb forms of 'hear'?

The verb forms of 'hear' are 'hear, heard, heard'.

Have you heard the news about a new teacher in the school?

Yes, I've heard the news about a new teacher in the school.

or: No, I haven't heard the news about ...

What are the verb forms of 'leave'?

The verb forms of 'leave' are 'leave, left, left'.

Have they left this room?

No, they haven't left this room.

What are the verb forms of 'make'?

The verb forms of 'make' are 'make, made, made'.

Have you made a mistake this

lesson?

Yes, I have made a mistake this lesson. or: No, I haven't made a mistake ...

What are the verb forms of 'mean'?

The verb forms of 'mean' are 'mean, meant, meant'.

We learnt the word 'happen'. What did the word mean?

The word 'happen' meant '...'.

What are the verb forms of 'smell'?

The verb forms of 'smell' are 'smell, smelt, smelt'.

Did your dinner smell good yesterday?

Yes, my dinner smelt good vesterday. or: No, my dinner didn't smell good yesterday, but it smelt bad.
