Am I going to the <b>door</b> ?	Yes, you're <b>going to</b> the <b>door</b> .
Am I coming from the <b>door</b> ?	Yes, you're <b>coming from</b> the <b>door</b> .
Where am I going?	You're <b>going to</b> the <b>window</b> .
Am I coming from the <b>table</b> ?	No, you aren't <b>coming from</b> the <b>table</b> , but you're <b>going to</b> the <b>table</b> .

Ireland	[ˈaɪələnd]
China	[ˈtʃaɪnə]
Japan	[dʒəˈpæn]
Europe	[ˈjʊərəp]
Asia	[ˈeɪʒə]

*Italy is in Europe. Japan is in Asia.*

Is Italy in Europe?	Yes, Italy is in <b>Europe</b> .
Where is Ireland?	<b>Ireland</b> is in <b>Europe</b> .
Is Japan in Asia?	Yes, <b>Japan</b> is in <b>Asia</b> .
Where is China?	<b>China</b> is in <b>Asia</b> .
Is China in Europe?	No, <b>China</b> isn't in <b>Europe</b> , but it's in <b>Asia</b> .
Is France in Asia?	No, France isn't in <b>Asia</b> , but it's in <b>Europe</b> .
Are Ireland and England in Asia?	No, <b>Ireland</b> and England aren't in <b>Asia</b> , but they're in <b>Europe</b> .
