

## **Big-Bigger-Biggest**



Sam is tall.	Sam is taller than Kim.	Sam is the tallest in the group.
Jane is pretty.	Jane is prettier than Kaye.	Jane is the prettiest among the girls.
Twinkle is smart.	Twinkle is smarter than May.	Twinkle is the smartest in the class.
Joe is big.	Joe is bigger than John.	Joe is the biggest among the boys.
Ryo is brave.	Ryo is braver than Mike.	Ryo is the bravest boy in the 5 <sup>th</sup> grade.
