## Let's Study!

**and**=addition or combination \*My friend **and** I attended the meeting.

**for**=explains reason or purpose \* I go to the park every Sunday, **for** I  
 (just like because) love to watch the ducks on the lake.

**but**= contrast \*I'm tired **but** happy.

**or**= choice \* Would like tea **or** coffee?

**neither** and **nor**= negation \* She spoke **neither** German **nor**  
 French.

**so**= purpose or result \* Erick was cold, **so** he put on a coat.

**yet**= introduces a contrasting idea that follows the preceding idea logically \* I always take a book to read, **yet** I  
 never seem to turn a single page.
