Let's Study!

much	with uncountable nouns in singular	How much money do you have left? I don't have much left.
many	with countable nouns in plural	How many dollars do you have left? I don't have many left.
a little	uncountable nouns	How much money do you have left? I have a little money left.
a few	countable nouns	How many dollars do you have left? I have a few dollars left.

^{**} We often use much/many in questions and negative sentences.
** We use a litle/a few with the more positive meaning.
