Have/has to -when something necessary and you have no choice to	Don't have to -when something is NOT necessary or not required
-we use have to with I, you, we and they Ex. I have to study for tomorrow's exams	- we use don't have to I, you, we and they Ex. I don't have to do the laundry. My mom does it for me.
we use has to with it, he ,she Ex. He has to clean the house before his parents arrive.	we use doesn't have to with it, he ,she Ex. He doesn't have to clean the house.
Had to is used in the past. Ex. He had to go to the supermarket.
