## When to use HAVE TO

We use have to when something is necessary and you have no choice.

Ex. The circus is not for free so we

have to pay \$5 each.

Tomorrow is my long exam so,

I have to study.

Use don't have to when something is NOT necessary or not required.

Ex. I don't have to clean my house on weekdays.

Mrs. Smith <u>doesn't have</u> to send her son to school because his already 10 years.
