Ms. Park: Excuse me for interrupting, but I think **I lost my way**.

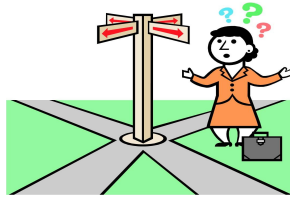
Man: **You're all turned around**. Are you from here?

Man: You're welcome. It's my pleasure to help you.
