



Are there differences between Eastern and Western cultural values? The answer according to recent surveys seems to be "yes, but..." . Although the recent survey showed substantial differences in Eastern and Western attitudes towards social harmony , authority and education, they also showed that the people of some Asian countries are more "Western" in their attitudes.

For example, when people from different Asian countries were asked about the importance of freedom of expression—a value which most Western expatriates hold in high regards--most saw it as a low priority; However, the people of Hong Kong, Japan and the Philippines disagreed with their Asian counterparts and rated freedom of expression as an important value in their daily lives. Moreover, when asked about the importance of individual rights, both Westerns and some Asians rated this value higher than any other Asian countries. Thus, the survey seems to suggest that there is a growing body of "global" values which people from countries around the world is beginning to share.
