Capital punishment, also referred to as the death penalty, is the execution of a person by the state as punishment for a crime. Crimes that can result in a death penalty are known as capital crimes or heinous crime. In most places that practice capital punishment today, the death penalty is reserved as punishment for premeditated murder, espionage, treason, or as part of military justice. In some countries sexual crimes, such as sexual assault and extramarital relationship carry the death penalty, as do religious crimes such as apostasy.
