

I vs i: Sound Comparison ENGLISH BELL.



- There are 2 clear difference between the vowel sounds /ɪ/ and /i:/.
 - 1. The **position of the mouth** (see chart below).
 - 2. /i:/ is normally (though not always) longer than /ɪ/.
- /i:/ is spelt with two vowels < ee / ei / ea > in written English.
- /ɪ/ is **spelt as < i >** in written English (except when weak).
