

What is Consciousness?



VOCABULARY

- *<u>Stroke</u> a blood vessel in their brain bursts or becomes blocked, which may kill them or make them unable to move one side of their body
- *<u>Hemispatial neglect</u> a neuropsychological condition in which, after damage to one hemisphere of the brain is sustained, a deficit in attention to and awareness of one side of the field of vision is observed
- *<u>Cut-corner</u> to do something in the easiest and shortest way, esp at the expense of high standards
- *<u>MRI</u> *(Magnetic Resonance Imaging)* a method by which medical staff can get a picture of soft parts inside a patient's body, using a powerful magnetic field
- *<u>Vegetative State</u> unable to move, think, or speak, and their condition is not likely to improve
